OUR DAILY SHOPPING IS THE EXTENSION OF OUR VALUES



- Focus: local governments
- Scope: advancement of understanding the GPP in public procurement procedure in Estonia
- Target group: public agencies, local governments, media
- Study: 68% of 15-19 year olds (total respondents 1168) consider it important that local governments practice their social responsibility and consider the livelihoods of the farmers and workers in the global south.

MAIN POINTS



- **Awareness:** 5 articles in local newspapers and national media on GPP, social media posts.
- **Image:** guidelines on considering the Fair Trade principles in GPP and trainings for public officials with the Ministry of Finance.
- **Accessibility:** We sent each local government (79) a letter encouraging them to work on GPP and offering support and counseling (before Christmas).
- **Attitude:** Baltic Environment Forum (BEF) and Mondo organised a seminar „Greener than a neighbour“ for local governments in November 2019. 36 people attended.
- **Knowledge:** detailed guidelines and two examples of how to prepare a GPP (1) for cleaning services and (2) for food in kindergartens. Later counseling.
- **Co-operation:** Mondo with BEF, Estonian Environmental Law Center (EELC) and Finnish Reilu kauppa ry.

MAIN MESSAGE
